



## 105475 - The story of Tha'labah (the pigeon of the mosque) is not true

### the question

Is the story of Tha'labah and saying it is the occasion of the revelation of (Amongst them are men who made a covenant with Allah....) is it true? He was called the pigeon of the Masjid.

### Detailed answer

The story about the reason for revelation of the verse (interpretation of the meaning): "And of them are some who made a covenant with Allaah (saying): 'If He bestowed on us of His Bounty...'" [al-Tawbah 9:74], which says that this refers to Tha'labah ibn Haatib, does not have a sound isnaad. Tha'labah ibn Haatib was an Ansaari who is counted among those who were present at Badr, and he was martyred on the day of Uhud, as was affirmed by a number of scholars, including al-Haafiz Ibn Hajar (may Allaah have mercy on him)

is that Allaah accepts the repentance of anyone who repents from sin, no matter what the sin is.
